## **April Message From Pastor Lee**

Dear brothers and sisters in faith,

On March 19, Sunday, several people told me the spring of 2023 would begin on the 20<sup>th</sup> of March. I hope it is real.

Spring is the season when all living things come to life. Spring also gives us fresh energy for our lives. Particularly, this season is very special to all Christians because of Easter, which celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

The Bible testifies that Jesus died, was brought back to life, and became the first fruit of resurrection to show eternal hope for every believer. If so, what kinds of lessons can we get from the resurrection of Jesus Christ?

First, we can see that Christianity is the living religion. According to Matthew 28:7, Jesus has risen from the dead. This scripture proves Jesus' Resurrection. Also, there is no denying this fact, because people have been testifying about it for more than 2,000 years; because there were many witnesses to see or meet Jesus Christ after he rose from the dead; because there is no tomb for Jesus, even though there are tombs for most founders and saints of many religions, such as Buddha from Buddhism, Confucius from Confucianism, Mohammed from Islam, and a great philosopher Socrates. Also, the Bible says that Enoch (Genesis 5: 21-24) and Elijah (2 King 2:1) didn't experience death, but they didn't show the victory of the resurrection. However, Jesus showed us the victory of the resurrection. Therefore, we need to remember that Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die (John 11:25)."

Second, it shows us our religion is the religion of the Word. If Jesus' resurrection just happened accidentally, it would have been nothing to our faith. However, because Jesus rose from the dead as the Bible said, it is so meaningful to us. The resurrection of Jesus was predicted in the Bible, and Jesus rose from the dead as was predicted. Christianity is the revealed religion. The word, "revelation," means something that is considered to be a sign or message from God. By the Word, this world was created. By the Word, Jesus Christ was born; by the Word, Jesus Christ was crucified; then by the Word, Jesus Christ rose from the dead.

These words are leading us to be saved from sins. These words are giving us the eternal hope. These words are changing us to be new people in faith. Therefore, we need to be humble before these words, the Word, and follow them.

Third, the resurrection of Jesus gave the disciples of Jesus hope. After the death of Jesus, all disciples went back to their hometowns and stepped back from the mission field. However, they met Jesus and were changed. How were they changed? Disheartened disciples received hope and courage and became more courageous. They bravely delivered the gospel to the people under the swords and lances of Roman soldiers and were martyred. What did change them? It was the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The resurrection of Jesus Christ changed people. It gave hope to disappointed people and courage to the discouraged.

In this season, I hope you are encouraged through the Resurrection of Jesus Christ; that you get hope and courage from it; that your lives are changed by his Resurrection; that you experience its victory.

On Tuesday, March 28, 2023, in church conference, our church voted to approve the terms of disaffiliation from the UMC. Immediately afterwards our church voted to join the Global Methodist Church. We would like to thank everyone who attended the meeting and for your support. The application to join the GMC will be sent later this week. Our next step will be to officially change the name of our church to the St. Marys Methodist Church along with a lot of legal documents. On June 14, 2023, at the Western PA General Conference, there will be a special vote to approve all churches that will be leaving the UMC. We've been told there are approximately 260 churches leaving UMC in Western PA. It's been a long process and we thank everyone for the support we've been given.
