### September Message



Dear Friends of Jesus and St. Mary's Church,

Greetings in the Name of Jesus who has called us to follow and serve Him. My name is Jeff Greenway, and I'm the President Pro Tempore of the Allegheny West Provisional Conference of the Global Methodist Church. I'm a native of Western Pennsylvania, and presently serve as the Lead Pastor at the Reynoldsburg Community Church near Columbus, OH.

I'm thankful for St. Mary's Church. I can remember hearing about your church 20 years ago when I served as a District Superintendent in Western Pennsylvania. I also remember celebrating the leadership of Chris Kindle. (I was his grandparent's pastor in Erie, and also served as Chris' Counseling Elder as he responded to God's call upon his life for ministry). Your congregation has a long history as a vital and vibrant community of faith, and I'm thankful for you and your partnership in the Gospel as part of our Conference.

I know the last few years have had their challenges and it has taken a lot of time, resources, and spiritual energy to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. It took courage and faith to step out of our former denomination without your pastor. I appreciate the spiritual maturity I've seen in the lay leadership of your congregation, and I'm committed to finding St. Mary's the kind of leader who can build on your past, and move you forward to a hopeful and fruitful future. I've been working with your Presiding Elder, Mark Hecht, and the rest of our Appointive Cabinet to secure your next lead pastor. Several months ago, we identified St. Mary's as a top priority appointment—meaning it's an anchor church we needed to get right. During the last seven months, we've had several discussions with potential pastors, but none of them was the right fit. To be honest, none of us felt any of those alternatives was "God's best" for St. Mary's—and in hindsight, I believe God was blocking our effort to find a "human solution" to expand our view to see "His solution."

We recently identified an exceptional pastor with an outstanding track record of serving churches and nurturing the leaders around him. He is a person of deep faith and impeccable integrity. He has grown every church he's ever served and is familiar with and loves north central Pennsylvania. He wants to come to St. Mary's, but is not able to be appointed until next summer (at the latest). I had previously reached out and asked him to come and serve St. Mary's, but he was not able to do so. The reason is he has given his word in his present context which requires him to remain in that role until he completes some responsibilities in the first six months of 2024.

In July, when out of options to provide the kind of pastor St. Mary's deserves, I asked this person if he would be willing to commit to serve St. Mary's as soon as his responsibilities in his present ministry assignment are complete. He was elated—and so was I. He gave me his word that if St. Mary's is willing to wait for him, he would come to serve as your pastor next summer.

I recently met with your Staff-Parish Relations Committee and reiterated this pastor's integrity—when he gives his word—he keeps it. He is not able to come until he completes a commitment next year—and has given his word to come to St. Mary's as soon as his commitment is complete. I believe all our failed efforts earlier this year was God getting us to be open to this pastor's appointment to St. Mary's.

I realize you are still in need to some consistency in spiritual leadership between now and then. Mark Hecht is working with your Staff-Parish Relations Committee to secure short-term interim pastoral leadership for the next 11 months. This will include persons who will be able to commit to preach, teach, provide counsel, and serve the sacraments for 4 to 8 weeks at a time. He also has secured commitments from several area pastors to be willing to assist in providing sacramental and pastoral support to your congregation. While we are not appointing your new pastor until next summer, we will do everything we can do to provide the spiritual leadership for your congregation which will bridge you to next summer when you receive the pastor your congregation deserves.

I know this is an extraordinary way to approach such an appointment, but we are living in extraordinary times, and I'm convinced God is in this. Your congregation is in the heart of my prayers—that this season of waiting will be healing and serve as a time of spiritual preparation for the future God holds!


