### November Message



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I wish my words could adequately explain the incredible experience I had at the Allegheny West Provisional Annual Conference of the Global Methodist Church (GMC) that I recently attended in Columbus, OH. So far, I've attended seven annual conferences for our church and this one was like nothing in the past. It was a gathering of over 1200 Spirit-filled, Jesus-loving, Bible-believing, warm-hearted, evangelical Christians worshiping and working together in a way that I had never experienced in prior conferences. There was very little looking back, the conference is looking forward. It all felt good. Thank you for letting me represent our church at the very first annual conference for the Allegheny West Provisional Conference of the Global Methodist Church. It was well worth the 5-hour trip to Columbus, and 5 hours driving back. It was a once in a lifetime experience.

When talking about conferences within the GMC, the terminology can sometimes be confusing, especially if you are new, because the term is used to describe types of meetings and is also used to represent geographical sections of churches. Let me try to explain.

☐ A "Charge" conference (meeting) is held once a year at each local church withing the GMC.
We had ours on October 29.
☐ An "Annual" conference (meeting) is held once a year where all churches in a within a
geographical conference meet. For us, it's all churches within Allegheny West Provisional
Conference that includes all of Ohio and the western portion of Pennsylvania. It's the
conference meeting, I just attended. There are numerous GMC geographical provisional
conferences around the world.
□ Next year will be the first "General" conference (meeting) of the Global Methodist Church. Two
or three delegates chosen from each geographical provisional conference around the globe will
attend. This is when the current Transitional Book of Discipline and the GMC organizational
structure will be finalized. The GMC wanted to wait until most of the churches were disaffiliated,
to have a broader representation.

I had a chance to speak with Jeff Greenway, President Pro-Tempore, at the conference and expressed my appreciation for all efforts and support for our church, and for the Christ-centered leadership displayed at the conference. Although there is still a lot of work to be done before the general conference next year, the GMC leadership is most capable.

When I think about the annual conference I just attended, look all the hard work that was done this year for the disaffiliation process, all the hard work that is done constantly by so many people within our church, seeing how much the GMC has stepped up to help our transition to a new pastor, seeing our attendance remaining strong, and the positive attitude of our Christ-centered members, it's obvious the Holy Spirit is present in the St Marys Methodist Church. I couldn't be happier, prouder, and thankful to be a member. We are truly blessed.

Thanks everyone and have a great Thanksgiving.


