February Message

I was asked by Shawna if I would like to do the newsletter article for February and I said I was excited to do so. As February 14 is Valentine's Day and is a celebration that honors St Valentine who, when the government forbid marrying (because it exempted the young men from being a soldier), he did marriages in secret. But our culture has made it about love, mainly eros (erotic) love, the love of a man for a woman. The reason this subject interests me so much is that love is a term that has been hijacked in our culture and its meaning has been destroyed by cultural redefinition. To some, love means we must always affirm a person's behavior no matter what or we do not love them. The other definition that is prevalent is that of emotional or physical attraction as being the most important part of a relationship. This plays out often in our society and a "commitment" is good until the emotion goes away! Then, we "fall out of love" and since it is all about me being "happy" I need to find another emotional attraction to make me happy again. This is not love in the traditional or biblical sense. True love is a sacrificial care for another person that looks out for what is best for them. Paul explains this in Ephesians 5: 25-30:

25 For husbands, this means love your wives, just as Christ loved the church. He gave up his life for her to make her holy and clean, washed by the cleansing of God's word. [c] 27 He did this to present her to himself as a glorious church without a spot or wrinkle or any other blemish. Instead, she will be holy and without fault. 28 In the same way, husbands ought to love their wives as they love their own bodies. For a man who loves his wife actually shows love for himself. 29 No one hates his own body but feeds and cares for it, just as Christ cares for the church. And we are members of his body.

This is "agape" or a sacrificial love. One of the strongest human stories of this love I have ever heard was about Sandra Day O'Conner. She was the first woman appointed to the Supreme Court. Her husband, John, had developed Alzheimer's and as the disease progressed, had to be put in an assisted living facility. As his memory of his former life disappeared, he developed a romantic relationship with another resident. Justice O'Conner would visit her husband and sit on a bench opposite him while he held hands with his girlfriend. She stated that she was happy that he could find some joy in the midst of the dreaded disease. This kind of love is a sacrificial love that few understand. To love in the biblical "agape" type love is sacrificing what may make us happy so that the one we "love" can be better for it.

One of our favorite verses is John 3:16 and states: "For this is how God loved the world: He gave[a] his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life."

This example of love that is one we too often gloss over as we are the beneficiaries of it, but in context, the Apostle Paul is explaining that this is the sacrificial type of love that a husband (and wife) should have for each other!!! This concept of love would revolutionize marriages. This kind of love in the church would make the world stop and take notice of our spiritual gatherings and this kind of love exhibited by us in the world would make us identifiable as Christ's disciples. Not a love that gives a person approval for whatever they want (if we love our children, we don't let them eat the entire cake! because we know it would not be good for them) but a love that looks out for the other person even at personal sacrifice to ourselves! This is God's love, Agape love, the love a disciple should exhibit in their interactions with those around them, especially their families (both genetic and spiritual). Read it again and put your name in it with appropriate wording to match. Put it inside the cover of your Bible or post it on your refrigerator.

For husbands, this means love your wives, just as Christ loved the church. **He gave up his life for her** ²⁶ to make her holy and clean, washed by the cleansing of God's word.

David Gates of Bread (a band from my day) had a song titled "Diary" that captures just a bit of this kind of love. In the song, a guy finds the diary of his girlfriend and it tells how she has found her true love. He is surprised as she doesn't show it but that is like her. He then reads the words again and starts to realize she means someone else but again, she doesn't show it. In an unusual expression of care for her happiness he says: "And as I go through my life, I will wish for her his wife, All the sweet things that she can find, All the sweet things they can find" https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=24IfD-0VUu4




