MY FINAL THOUGHTS ON HOPE

The Christian community knows that God is Lord of history, that he will ultimately win the victory over evil, that nothing human persons can do will ultimately thwart his creative purpose for the world. This means, first of all, that **we have something to look forward to.** Even in the worst of times we know that there is a future in which God will work out his purpose for the world he has created.

In the second place, our Christian hope means that we have something worth waiting for. One of the things we discover about life is that God's time is not always our time. We find out that waiting may be required of us and that waiting can be one of the genuine signs of our faith. We learn patience, knowing that "not yet" can be a creative word from God for our life in the world. Finally, our Christian hope means that we have something to do.

Our hope encourages us to move into the world and work with all our strength to identify with the movement of God's life into the future. This means standing with Jesus to preach good news to the poor, proclaim the release to the captives, and to set at liberty to those who are oppressed. It means marching with Martin Luther King, Jr. Until we are free at last. It means creating something beautiful for God like Mother Teresa did by sharing Christ with the homeless and the dying. We move into the world, ministering to others as if the future depends entirely on us, knowing that, in the end, it depends entirely on God. This is our hope.

Because of this, the story of any human life, at any given point in time is an unfinished story. I feel that I am a work-in-progress and that my life has changed profoundly in my ministry. Furthermore, we do not know what undiscovered country lies ahead of us, what joys and sorrows await us, and what companions we will meet along the way. But we do know that God can be trusted.

In my own unfinished story, the thread that has held my life together this far, God's presence, continues to hold. When I think about how his gracious presence has guided me and protected me in the past and enabled me to find meaning for my life, I know that the future is secure and that I can look forward to it with great expectations.

Through many dangers, toils, and snares, I have already come; 'tis grace hath brought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home.



Four Views of the End Times

For nearly 2000 years, Christians have wondered when Christ will return again. When he ascended into heaven, his disciples asked about the timing. The scriptures have many passages that refer to this important event. In this study, we'll explore what the Bible actually says about the end times that lead to the return of Jesus Christ. The differing ideas that divide believers into four major points-of-view are examined. This study shows four different Revelation time lines and tackles Dispensational Premillennialism, Postmillennialism, Historic Premillennialism, and Amillennialism. For each view, the study includes a definition, supporting Scriptures, a time line of the view's popularity, and a sampling of Christian leaders supporting that view. Common questions and answers are handled as part of each session, so you don't need to be the expert.

TV shows and movies throw around words such as Antichrist, Great Tribulation, Rapture, 666, and the Second Coming of Christ, but what do the Scriptures say? The differing ideas that divide believers into four major points-of-view are examined in the Four Views of the End Times.


MEMBERSHIP DRIVE for Methodist Women


